What matters most in language communication is not the language itself, but what you can do with it. Incorporating the basic ideas of CEFR (Common European Framework of Reference for Languages), this course uses the Action-oriented Approach (AoA) as teaching methodology for learning Japanese language. In this method, communication is considered as a social activity designed to accomplish specific tasks and student are active participants in the learning process. By performing a set of tasks in a real-life situation, students will acquire solid speaking skills with which they can effectively communicate their thoughts and have meaningful interaction with the people around them. Students are encouraged to actively engaged in these activities so that they can improve their proficiency level of Japanese language to the fullest. Additionally, students will expand their vocabulary/Kanji through online pre-class assignment and practice paragraph writing by working on with their after-class assignment.

Speaking, conversation, paragraph writing

Study Objectives (General)

This course is designed in order for the students to step into the level of CEFR B1, ACTFL Speaking Intermediate Low, equivalent of upper JPLT N4 -lower N3.

CEFR B1 (Threshold or pre-Intermediate) is the first level of the Independent Range- At the end of this level B1, students will have crossed a threshold in your language-learning project: students will be able to -understand the main points of clear standard input on familiar matters regularly encountered in work, school, leisure, etc.

-deal with most situations likely to arise while travelling in an area where the language is spoken.

-produce simple connected text on topics that are familiar or of personal interest.

-describe experiences and events, dreams, hopes and ambitions and briefly give reasons and explanations for opinions and plans.

In this couse taught using Action-oriented Approach (AOA), students will practice Japanese to fullfill the goals or CAN-DO aims set for this cousrse

For example, the CAN-DO aims of Lecture 1 is "You can talk about your hobbies and life in Japan with people you meet for the first time at your part-time jobs and interest groups."

The instructor will provide all the 15 CAN-DO aims during the first lecture.

In the 15 lessons of this course, students will practice speaking Japanese and do activities using they have learned from each chapter of textbook. One chapeter of text book consisted of two small topics, each one will be covered in each class. For example, small topic of lesson 1 is "New Friends".
