Course Outline

After you have gained some proficiency in your Japanese and feel a little comfortable to use it. It is now time to progress to the next level. The aim of this course is to prepare the students to take specialized courses taught in Japanese language in the future. Together with Action-oriented Approach (AoA), the course is designed upon Content and Language Integrated Learning (CLIL) approach where students learn a subject and a second language at the same time. The 9 topics of 17 SDGs goals are covered in Spring Semester and good practices to tackle with the challenges will be explored in the class. The class being content focused, students are trained to think and learn in Japanese language. Through peer-to-pear learning activities such as discussion, peer-reading and peer response, the students will develop integrated Japanese language skills including vocabulary building, reading and essay writing by working on with their assignments before and after each class.

Study Objectives (General)

This course is designed in order for the students to obtain Japanese language skills of CEFR B1 level (Mid-High), ACTFL Speaking Intermediate Mid-High, equivalent of JLPT N3

CEFR B1 (Threshold or pre-Intermediate) is the first level of the Independent Range- At the end of this level B1, students will have crossed a threshold in your language-learning project: students will be able to

- -understand the main points of clear standard input on familiar matters regularly encountered in work, school, leisure, etc.
- -deal with most situations likely to arise while travelling in an area where the language is spoken.
- -produce simple connected text on topics that are familiar or of personal interest.
- -describe experiences and events, dreams, hopes and ambitions and briefly give reasons and explanations for opinions and plans.

Study Objectives (Specific) The course aims to achieve the following:

In this couse taught using Action-oriented Approach (AOA), students will practice Japanese to fullfill the goals or CAN-DO aims set for this cousrse. The instructor will provide all the 15 CAN-DO aims during the first lecture. Along with them, students will also explore 9 goals of SDGs, which include "good health and well-being", "gender equality", "climate action", and so on.

In the 15 lessons of this course, students will practice speaking Japanese and do activities using they have learned from each chapter of textbook. They will also learn about SDGs' some good practices that changed the future. The instructor will provide the detailed schedule during the first lecture.
